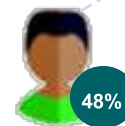

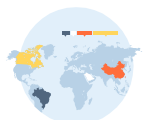

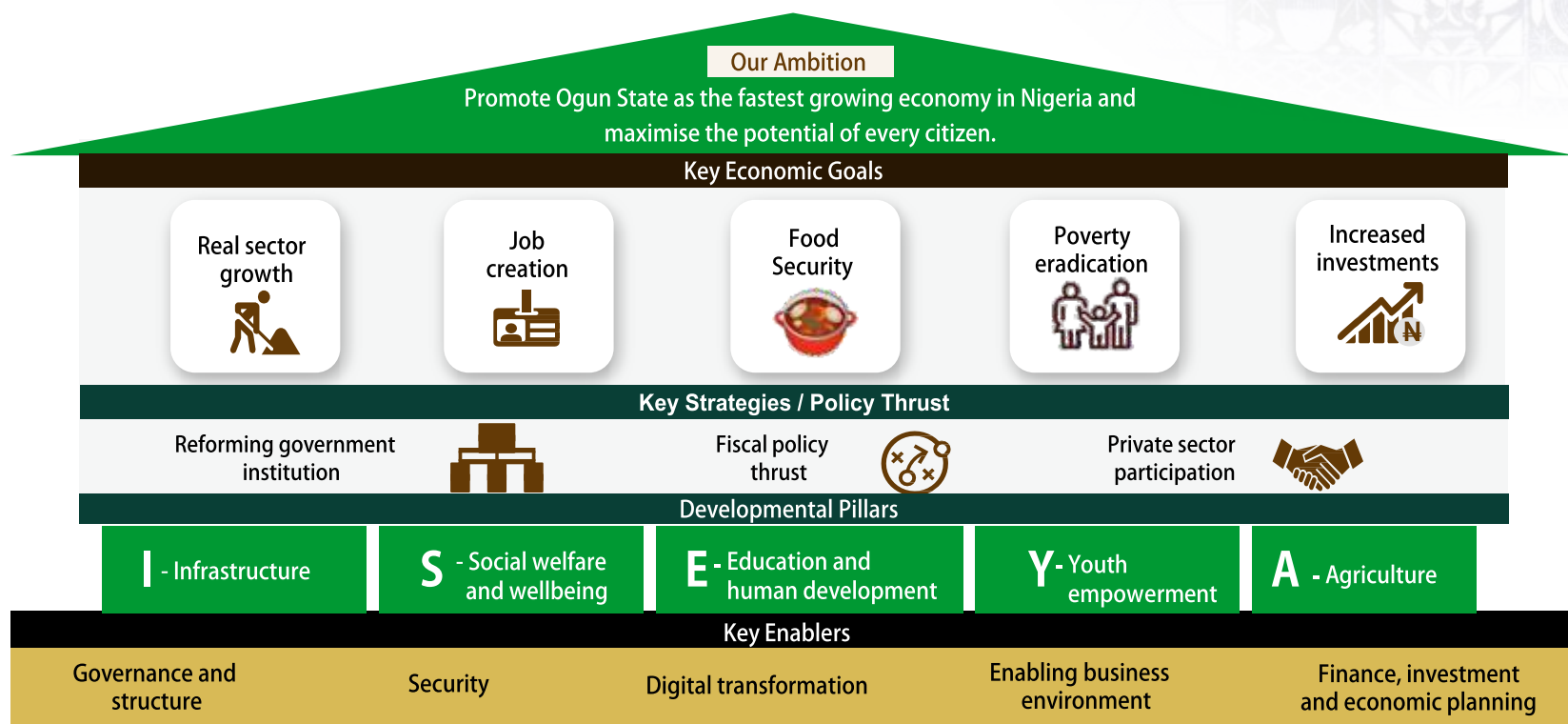

Real sector growth

- Diversify the primary sectors and drive growth in identified key sub-sectors (Agriculture, Transport and logistics, manufacturing and construction)
- Target an average annual growth rate of 25% in line with our ambition of being the fastest growing economy in Nigeria



Job creation

- **Job creation and ease of business** – target new businesses & encourage local talent & capacity
- **Job aggregation and matching** – bring job seekers in Ogun state closer to Nigerian companies
- **Skills development and training** – promote vocational, non-technical and soft skills aimed at giving Ogun citizens an edge
- **Talent hunt and management** – discover, enhance and empower creative talent across the State



Food Security

 - Drive **growth in production** to match population growth rate
 - Drive **technological innovations** which would eliminate constraints around labour adoption capacity
 - Adopt **fiscal policies** aimed at reducing inequality in income distribution
 - **Reduce cost of production** by increasing availability of necessary infrastructure
 - **Access to credit and land** for agricultural extension services



Increased investments

- The developmental strategy for Ogun State is hinged on the private sector. Key elements include:
 - Improve Ease of Doing Business to attract investments
 - Collaborate with private sector to invest in the development of Economic Development Clusters and the key Anchor Projects , etc. alongside adequate baseline infrastructure such as road access, electricity, broadband, etc.
 - Explicit sector strategies based on developmental pillars (ISEYA framework)
 - Appropriate regulatory framework and continued government support to ensure ease of doing business in Ogun State

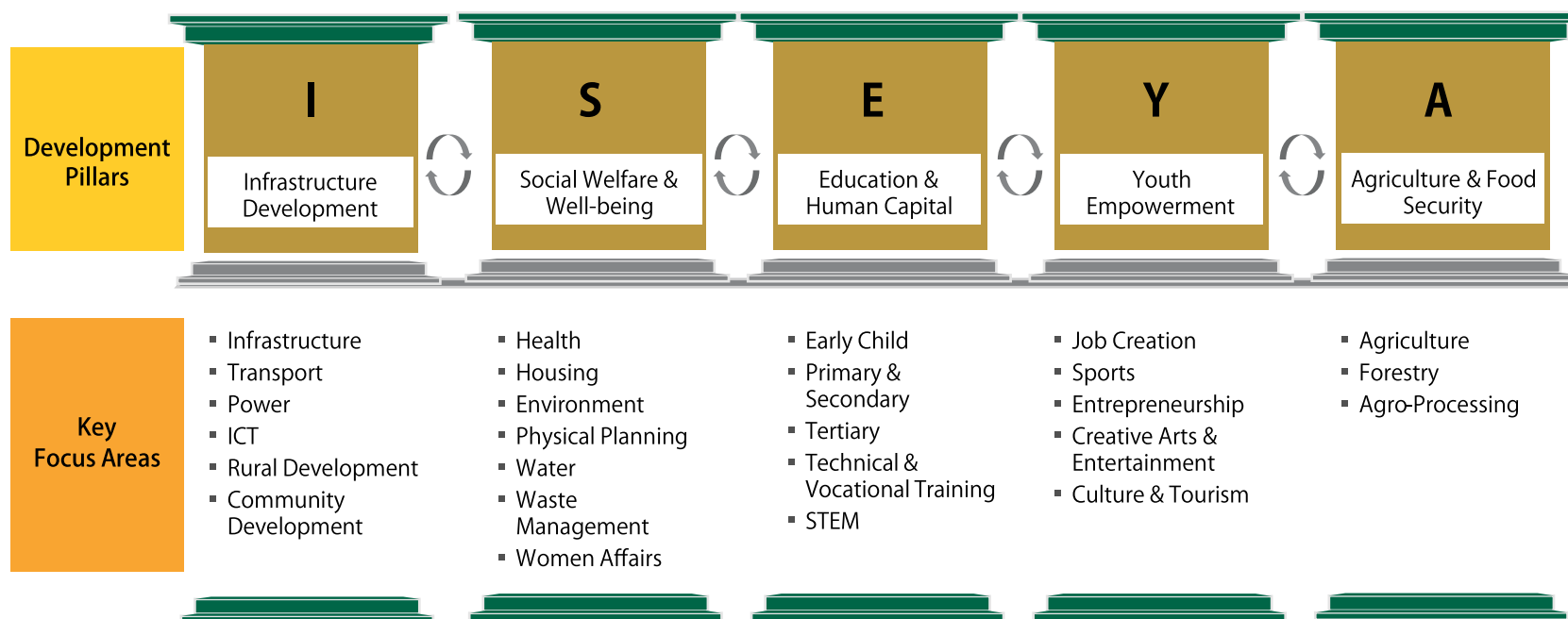

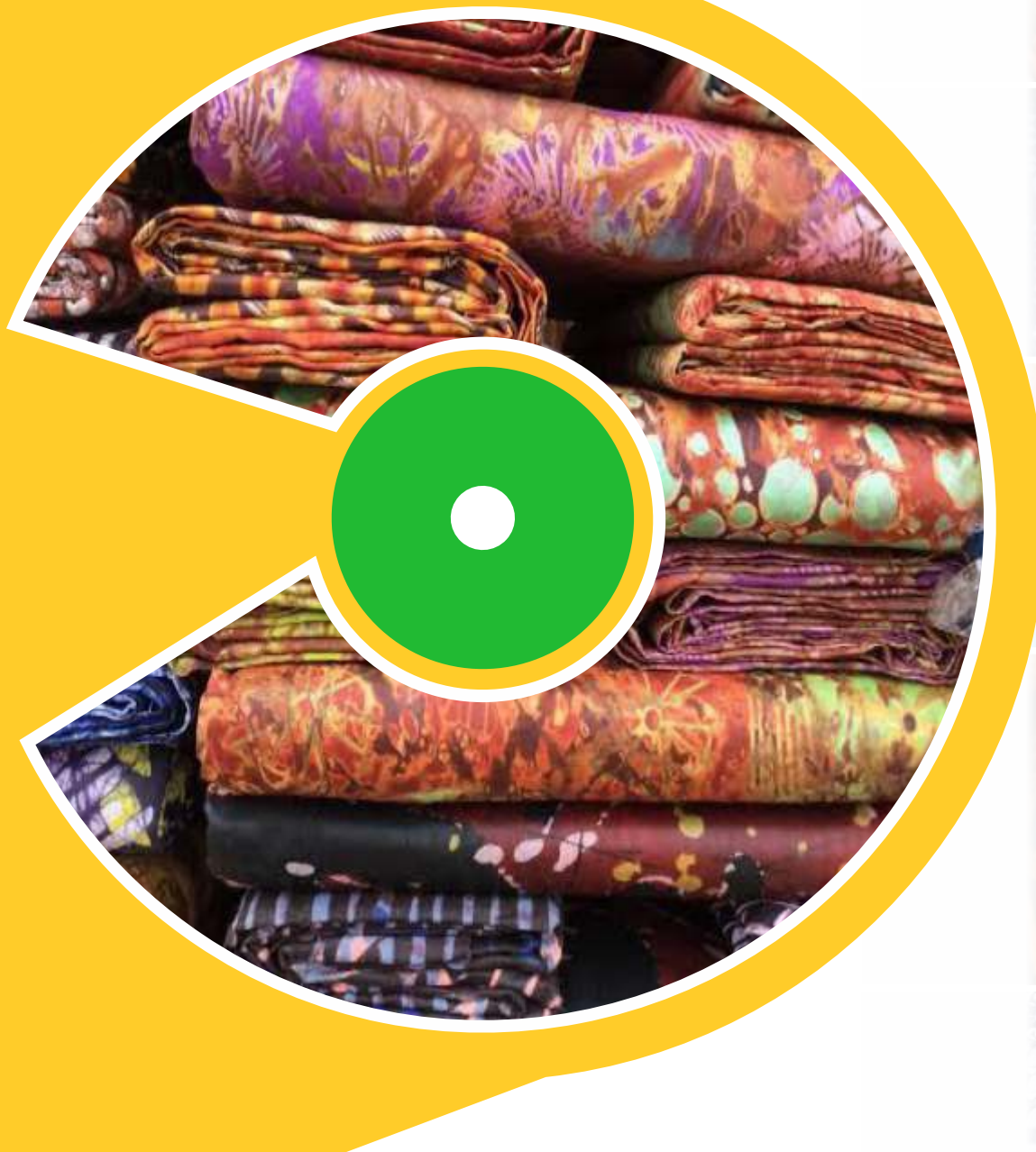
Setting the Context: Sector Contribution

Why Ogun State?

Case for Investment

Location

1

- Ogun **borders Lagos State** to the South, **Oyo and Osun** States to the North, **Ondo** to the East and the **Republic of Benin and African sub-continent** to the West. The State also has a **road network link** from North to West, from West to East and West to South.

Rich Arable Land

2

- The State has **large expanse of land for agricultural, industrial and commercial purposes**. It also has fertile land with 90% of its total landmass being arable land **suitable for Agriculture**, however only 30% of it is under cultivation.

Industrial Hub

3

- **Largest industrial zones in the country** – the Ogun-Guandong Free Trade Zone located at Igbesa, Olokola Free Trade Zone, Kajola Free Trade Zone with potential for value chain effects.
- Ogun State is delivering its first **Special Agro-Industrial Processing Zone (SAPZ)**, located within Remo Economic Development Cluster, which is one of the six (6) newly established Economic Development Clusters (EDCs).

Technological Hub

4

- Establishment of Technological Hubs in partnership with some global tech companies.

Competitive labour costs

- One of the most competitive labour costs in Nigeria.
- Our **skilled labour** force offers a huge opportunity for investors and investments to thrive.

Market size and access

- Closest in proximity to Lagos, that contributes over 60% of Nigeria's GDP and is Africa's 5th largest economy. The State benefits immensely from this proximity and is growing as an investment hub.
- The State offers **ready access to 181 million consumers in the Nigerian Market**, as well as consumers in the **West African Market**.

- The establishment of **Ogun State Investment Promotion and Facilitation Agency (OgunInvest)**. The Agency is coordinating all private sector investment activities, act as a one stop shop for investors and enable an investor friendly business environment.

Case for Investment

in connection with the Federal and State Government's commitment to boost investment across the State, several policy initiatives have been introduced including the following...

Federal Government Incentives

- **One-stop-shop** to facilitate investments.
- **Industrial hubs for special services** and **value chain optimisation**.
- Indefinite utilisation of **Corporate Tax Losses**.
- **Unlimited repatriation** of foreign exchange earnings.
- **Special Economic Zones:**
 - **100% foreign ownership** of investment.
 - **Free transferability** of capital, profits and dividends by Foreign Investors.
 - **Tax holiday** for investment in identified industries/products approved as **pioneer industry/product** for a maximum period of 5 years.
 - **Duty-free, tax free** on import of raw materials for goods destined for re-export.
 - Waiver on all **import and export licenses**.
 - Waiver advantage on **expatriate quota** for companies operating in the Zones.

Ogun State Government Incentives

- **Available land for allocation to interested investors** (Over 50,000 ha of land available for land clearing).
- Industrial hubs with available infrastructure (**Power, Water and Security**) for shared services, with **potential synergies and value chain opportunities** – **10,000ha** of industrial hubs to be developed.
- 3 State sponsored FTZs (largest number in Nigeria), including the Olokola FTZ which has the deepest shore in Nigeria and **2nd deepest in Africa**.
- **Harmonised taxes**.
- **OgunInvest** to attract and facilitate the entry of new investors as well as support existing investors
- Rebates on **select levies and charges**.
- Rebates on **land acquisition costs**.
- Availability of **tax credits**.

Infrastructure: Key Opportunities (1/2)

Mass Transit

- Opportunity exists to invest in an electrified standard gauge rail line infrastructure by extending the Lagos Oyingbo to Agbado (red) Rail Line service hinterland to Ogun State around the Ota/Ijoko and Ifo/Kajola axis. ("Ogun Rail" or "the Project") in Ogun State, Nigeria.
- Opportunity exists to extend Lagos Blue line hinterland through Okokomaiko/Agbara/Lusada
- Ogun Rail is a c.82km development running from Ijoko to Olodo with c.9 rail stations.
- Opportunity exists in intra-city/inter-cities CNG Powered Bus Mass Transit service
- Opportunity exists in the development of a modern trailer park at Ogere.
- Key investment considerations include strong projected cashflow tax free cashflows through Pioneer Status Legislation and improved quality of life for Ogun State and other neighbouring states in Nigeria.

Toll Roads At Strategic Locations

- **19.2km Atan/Lusada/Agbara/Morogbo Road (Construction Awarded)**
 - The project is in a densely populated area due to its proximity to Lagos State
 - Opportunity exists in toll road concession
- **14km Epe/Ijebu-Ode Road (completed)**
 - Ijebu-Ode is a boundary road between Lagos State and Ogun State.
 - Opportunity exists in toll road concession
- **69.2km Abeokuta/Abule Egba Road (Construction Awarded)**
 - This opportunity is to Build Operate and Transfer (BOT) and is in an urban community with a high population of traders.

Power

- **Independent Gas Power Plants** for Residential /Industrial Hubs with **power requirement** as follows:
 - Agbara Industrial Estate: **200MW**
 - Flourgate Estate: **50MW**
 - Ota: **50MW**
- Renewables energy for **community and industrial hubs (10,000 ha** of industrial hubs to be developed).
- Estimated Demand (Ogun State):**1,500 MW**
- Ogun State Government (OGSG) partners with developers to build, own and operate Independent Power Plants (IPP) dedicated to state government entities and buildings.
- Embedded Generation: Opportunities exist for developers to partner with Ogun State Government (OGSG) to build, own and operate an IPP to supply customers in identified distribution zones/clusters. Potential to also partner or seek the consent of IBEDC to use their distribution network to transmit/distribute power.

Infrastructure: Key Opportunities (2/2)

Logistics

- **Airport**
 - Opportunities exist in concessioning of the built Gateway International Agro-Cargo Airport, Cargo handling, warehousing, recreation and tourism centres within Aerotropolis.
 - Located within Remo Economic Development Cluster, adjoining the Special Agro-Industrial Processing Zone (SAPZ) to provide efficient/effective connectivity for international, regional and local cargo and passengers services.
 - The Airport complements Ogun State's status as the foremost Industrial Hub in Nigeria and optimizes the logistics & distribution value chain thereby improving competitiveness and enabling the State take full advantage of African Continental Free Trade Zone (AfCFTA) for economic growth and Development.
 - The Airport which is within the Aerotropolis with a land allocation of 10,000ha consolidates Ogun State's in the Agriculture/Agro-Allied and Manufacturing Industries
 - The Airport already received Regulatory Aviation Permit from the Nigerian Civil Aviation Authority (NACA).

Dry Port

- Kajola Dry Port City is located within Kajola Free Trade Zone (KFTZ) along an existing Railway Corridor, one of the train stations for the National rail line.
- The 2000ha Dry Port City will complement Ogun State's status as a strategic logistics hub in Nigeria.
- The Dry Port is intended to be executed under a Public-Private Partnership (PPP) Project Structure

Investment Opportunities exist in Kajola Dry Port City for:

- Design and construction of stations, sidings and turn-outs
- Industrial and residential property construction
- Establishment of technology hub
- Terminal buildings and storage facilities
- Establishment of entertainment cities
- Establishment of MSME centres
- Establishment of distribution and logistics hubs

Sea Port

- Olokola Deep Sea Port is an integral part of the Olokola Free Trade Zone (OKFTZ), with the deepest shore in Nigeria and the second deepest in Africa.
- OKFTZ is designed to promote local and international trade, transit trade, export processing, offshore finance, wharf management, haulage and other ancillary activities.
- The zone is located about 100km east of Lagos, the commercial centre of Nigeria and right in front of the new oil and gas deposit discoveries.
- Olokola Deep Sea Port is designed to be strictly Private sector driven
- It is conceived as an Integrated Multipurpose Complex serving predominantly as Oil and Gas logistic base as well as an Export processing zone.
- It is intended to handle Cargoes, Oil & Gas and other Bulk Liquids.
- Immediately hinterland from Olokola are vast natural resources such as Cocoa, Rubber, Timber, Palm oil and Solid Minerals to mention a few, resources that can generate off take interest in the zone couple with the DSP facility within proximity.
- The site is approximately 45mins drive from the Lagos market

Investment Opportunities exist in Olokola Free Trade Zone for:

- Development of Deep-Sea Port.
- Development and Management of wharf• Mineral exploitation
- Development of Gas infrastructure
- Construction of mixed estate
- Recreation and tourism centres.

Housing

Opportunities exist in the following housing schemes to reduce the housing deficits in the State:

- Regeneration of the old GRA Schemes in 4 locations into smart cities of 1000 high- end housing units under Public Private Partnership (PPP) arrangement.
- Development of 5000 low-cost housing units in 4 locations in partnership with the Federal Housing Authority under the Renewed Hope Initiative.
- Development of 2500 low-cost housing units across the State, an initiative of the Federal Ministry of Housing

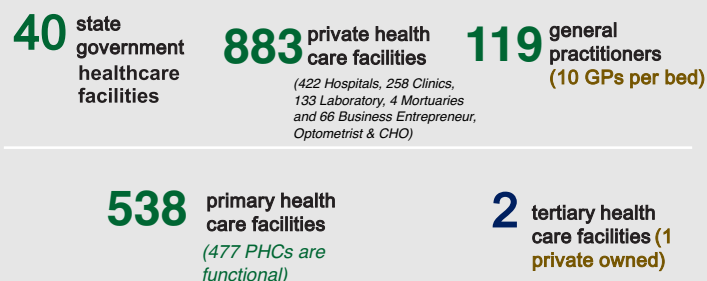

- With increasing demand for quality services, increasing middle class and huge outbound medical tourism, the private sector is responding through increased private-public partnerships in healthcare delivery.

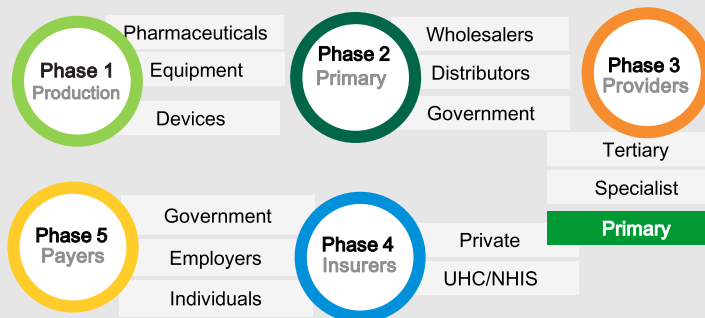
COMPETITIVE ADVANTAGE

- Significant potential for **import substitution** which takes the form of outbound national medical tourism (**US\$500 million to US\$1 billion annually**).
- **Projected market growth** with CAGR of **16.2%** from **USD9 billion in 2013 to USD111 billion in 2030** for health related goods and services nationwide.

SUPPORTING POLICIES

Ogun State Health Sector Policy is aimed at:

- **Increasing Coverage** – Primary Health Care is a priority. Making healthcare services accessible and as wide a reach as possible.
- **Funding** – Leveraging innovations in Health Insurance and Fintech solutions.
- Preventative Healthcare and Quality Assurance.
- Develop the State as a **Regional and National hub for Medical Tourism** with an emphasis on a hub and spoke approach.

Healthcare: Key Opportunities

Public -Private Partnerships

- **350-bed University Teaching Hospital Facility** with opportunities to contract on specific service delivery points.
- **250-bed Hospital** situated in Abeokuta (**Capital of Ogun State**) **equipped to provide** Radiology Diagnostic, Laboratory, Accident and Emergency, Maternal & Childcare services, Oncology & Nephrology services, Surgical services and Outpatient Clinics.

Pharmaceutical opportunities

- Imports still remain key to meeting **growing local demand for medicines** in Nigeria.
- Nigeria's imports of pharmaceutical products was **US\$606.31 million** in 2018.
- The combined revenue base for the sector for Nigeria and Ghana was estimated to be **\$3.12 billion in 2018** – representing an average growth rate of **13.4% since 2003**.
- **Significant opportunity for Greenfield investment** for import substitution and to serve West African markets.
- Large deposits of resources required for the pharmaceutical industry - **Large deposits of Kaolin, Gypsum, Calcium, Mica and Tar sand**.

Other opportunities

- Conversion of the remnant of a moribund **Gateway pharmaceuticals to a medical equipment assembly plant** that is capable of supplying CT scanners as well as digital X-ray machines to the Nigerian and regional tertiary and secondary level hospitals.
- **Health Care Infrastructure rehabilitation** - opportunity to upgrade existing and develop Primary Healthcare Centres, given the high number of out of service PHCs (**c.45% non-operational**).

Agriculture: Key Opportunities (2/4)

Land clearing

- As part of the expansionary activities to drive agriculture in the State, opportunity exists for land clearing at the following locations:
 - **50,000 hectares** of Land at Ogun Central (Odeda/Obafemi-Owode).
 - **25,000 hectares** of Land at Ogun West (Imeko Afon).
 - **25,000 hectares** of Land at Ogun East (Ikene, Isara, Ijebu-Ode and Ijebu-Igbo).



Out growers/Off takers Agro-processing

• Cassava

- Opportunities exist in the expansion of cassava production through increase in size of farmland cultivated and through the introduction of high yielding varieties.
- Ogun State currently has over 40 cassava medium processing outfits and 7 large processing industries
- Land available for cassava planting is **180,000 hectares**.

• Oil palm

- There are opportunities for Joint Investments to rehabilitate State Owned Plantations - Government plantations in **Ipokia, Lomiro and Apoje** and establish new ones.
- Linkage to Existing farmers- over 1,000 Registered oil palm farmers are registered with the Ministry of Agriculture
- Land available for oil palm cultivation is **30,000 hectares**.

• Cotton

- Best climate and soil to produce the best varieties of cotton preferred in the international market (**Samcott11, 12, 13**). Ogun State is the major producer of these varieties which are largely grown in Iwoye-Ketu, Imeko-Afon LG, Aworo, Pedepo in Yewa North LG and Imala in Abeokuta North LG of the State.
- Land available for cotton planting is **10,000 hectares**.

Agriculture: Key Opportunities (3/4)

Vegetables and Spices

- Global production of vegetables is about **1.34 billion MT**. In 2019, Nigeria was ranked as the 6th largest producer of vegetables in the world..
- The demand for vegetables and spices continue to increase especially for export which can generate high income for farmers because of their high market value and profitability.
- Nigeria is currently the second largest producer of fresh tomatoes in Africa producing **10.8%** of the fresh tomatoes in the region. Globally, the country is the **14th largest tomato producer with 2.3 million tonnes in 2016**.
- Over the last decade, the production of fresh tomatoes in Nigeria has grown by **25%** from **1.8 million tonnes** to an estimated **2.3 million tonnes**.

Out growers/Off takers Agro-processing

• Cocoa

- Ogun State cocoa production accounts for 70% of total production which in quantity amounts to approximately 400 tonnes of Nigeria's total production. (Nigeria Cocoa industry activity).
- Cocoa can be produced in all the 20 Local Government of Ogun State with good fertile soil.
- Ogun State occupies the 4th position among the Cocoa Producers in Nigeria.
- Land available for cultivation of cocoa is 640,000 Hectares.

• Cashew

- Ogun State production output for year 2023 is estimated as 4,300 MT of Cashew, 65% of Cashew nuts and the Cashew average yield per ha is between 400-450kg, Source: Ministry of Agriculture
- Ogun State has 5 large scale cashew processing companies
- Nigeria's production figure as at 2023 stands at 350,000 MT per annum and 550KG/Ha per annum, Source: National Bureau of Statistics, CRIN

Rice

- The State's expertise traditionally lies in the cultivation of specialty rice called '**Ofada**'..
- Rice is grown in **11 LGAs** in the State.
- Rice farms cultivated by State Government supported youth groups across the State are at a combined land size of over 1,000 hectares.
- The State Government has installed 2 Rice Mills at Sawonjo in Yewa -North L.G.A (20 tons/day capacity) and Asero – Abeokuta in Abeokuta South LGA (50 tons/day capacity). Presently the Asero Mill has been consented to a private Company called OKUN RICE

Agriculture: Key Opportunities (4/4)

Ranching

- Ogun State currently meets 25% of the meat needs of Lagos State with an opportunity to increase supply.
- **The State has an enabling policy to support ranching.**
 - Anti- grazing Bill and a meat Traceability and Animal Identification Bill
 - Promotion of Investment into Quality Beef slaughter/ processing facilities through PPP or indirect investment
- **The opportunity for ranching in the State includes management of existing facilities at Lafenwa and Ogere and Joint Investment on Green Field Projects**
 - Ogun West axis for cattle market abattoir and meat processing
 - Ogun Central axis for meat processing
 - Ogun East axis for cattle market and meat processing
 - Ishara Remo Cattle Ranch enclave

Other opportunities

- Poultry farming – the State has the **highest commercial poultry rearing** (c. 4.5million birds) in the country. Investors are invited to consider investment in Broiler production and in storage facilities for profit.
- Fish farming/ Aqua-culture – the State has the **largest production cluster** in the fish sector in Africa situated at Eriwe, Ijebu Ode.
- **Management of rice farms** in the state in a fully mechanized system: planting, routing management, harvesting and post-harvest. This would lead to reduction in costs of inputs and ensure more stable sourcing.

Information, Communication & Technology: Key Opportunities

Business Process Outsourcing

- The global market for BPO, according the US research firm HfS, already has surpassed **\$300 billion** and is growing at **5% per annum**.
- With the **largest population on the continent**, favourable demographics (**half of which is below the age of 25**), English as the official language and the cultural proximity to serve clients in the **Middle East, Africa, Europe and the USA**, this amounts to a compelling proposition. Nigeria's **time zone**, particularly **suited to serving Europe**, gives the country a major advantage over outsourcing destinations in Asia.
- The BPO sector **is labour-intensive** and ideally suited to the **demographics of Ogun State**, the propensity is to create a large numbers of jobs, of which **50% to 60% tend to be taken up by women**.
- Since BPO tends to bring the jobs to where the people are, it can be delivered effectively from Ogun State.
- Advances in communication technologies have enabled operational functions to be performed remotely and this is effectively supported by the State's infrastructure which includes a **Fibre Optic broadband internet access**.

Other opportunities

- Establishment of **IT Training Centres** for the training of students to become proficient in Information Technology.
- Establishment of **IT Innovation Hubs** where resources would meet with IT knowledge and skills.
- Provision of **internet facilities** across the State.
- Establishment of **data centres** given the **unsaturated cloud market** in the State.
- Provision of **E-governance** in order to drive the agenda of the State by **providing new and innovative information systems** which the State can integrate into existing systems in areas such as **education, health, revenue generation**.
- Delivery of **Smart City Initiatives** - Information Systems (hardware and software) etc. to drive the State and society in areas such as **home management, waste management, transport system, and healthcare**.
- **Establishment of 3D printing** centres/training in prototyping, low volume production, creation of mechanical parts, printing of biomedical devices.

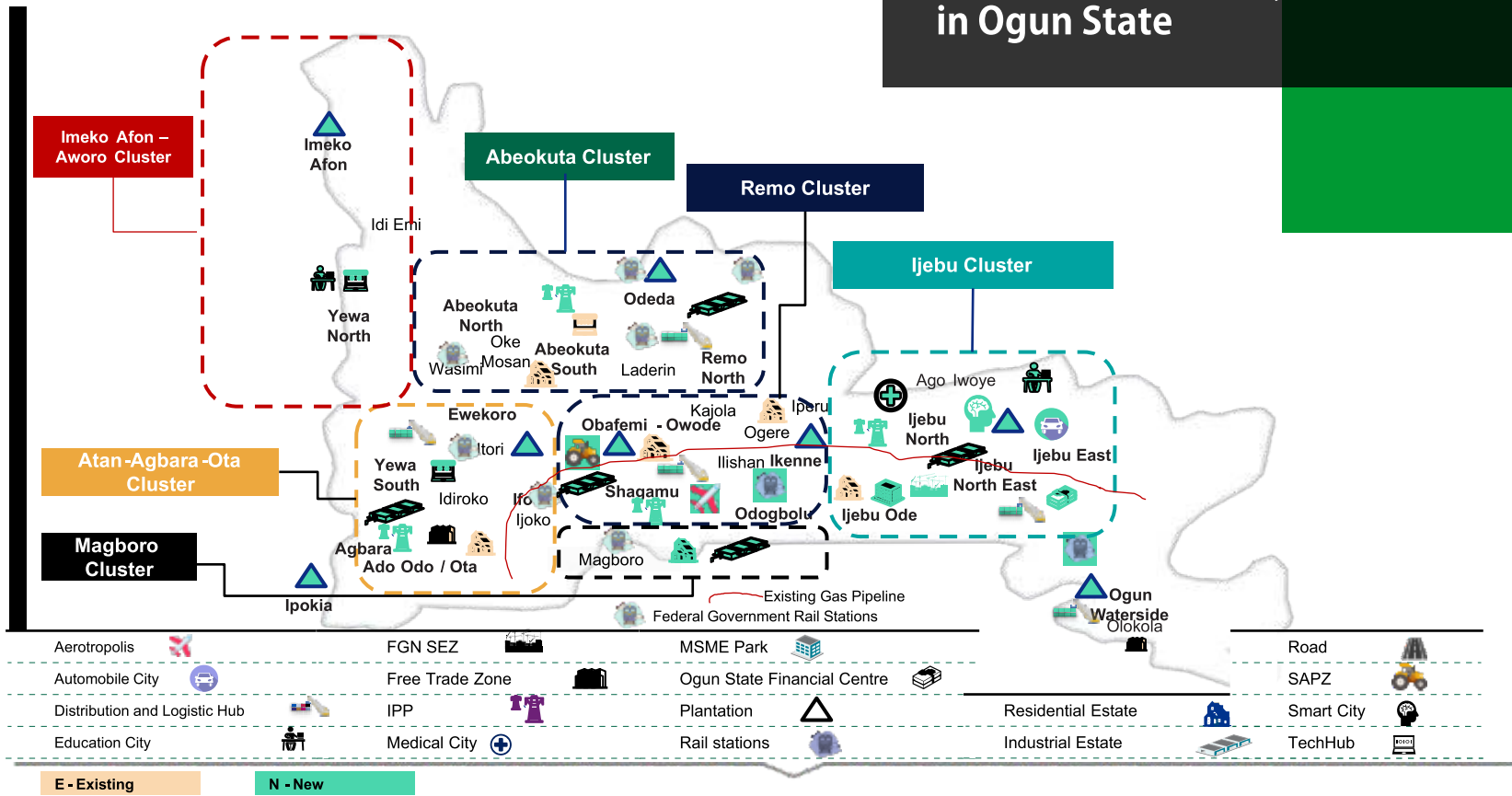
